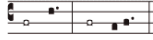

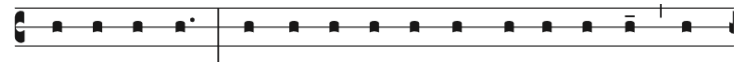

Be Thou my health and life.

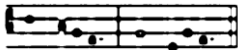
